Important Information Regarding Medication

Please be aware that from September 2018 we will no longer be giving 'non prescription' medication to children during the school day.

If your child is unwell and you would like them to take a non-prescription medication throughout the day then you are welcome to come into school to administer it. Ideally, we would recommend that children be given medication prior to the school day where possible.

For prescribed medications, inhalers and creams – please ensure you complete the medical consent forms to authorise us to administer the prescribed dosage throughout the school day.

AVOIDABLE ABSENCE IN TERM TIME

IMPORTANT: Please read carefully the information below.

WARNING: If you allow your child to miss school in term time for an avoidable reason without obtaining the prior approval of the school, you may be issued with a Penalty Notice* per parent per child, or made the subject of court proceedings under section 444 Education Act 1996.

As a parent/carer, you can demonstrate your commitment to your child's education by not allowing your child to miss school for anything other than an exceptional and unavoidable reason.

Penalty Notice Reminder

Here at Carclaze Community Primary School, we recognise that there are occasions when it is appropriate to authorise an absence, such as when a pupil is genuinely too ill to attend school, has a medical appointment that cannot be taken outside of school hours or a request for leave has been agreed in exceptional circumstances.

However, the Government does not support parents taking children out of school unless the school agrees this is appropriate under 'exceptional circumstances'. Any request for leave should be made in writing to the Head Teacher using the school's request form.

If you decide to still take your child out of school, without permission, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may refer the matter to Cornwall Council who may decide to take legal action against you. A penalty notice can be issued under Section 444A and 444B of the Education Act 1996. This carries a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the penalty notice may result in Court action. Persistent absences not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates Court, leading to fines up to £2,500 and/or custodial sentences *. The Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court.

You are welcome to contact the school to discuss any concerns you may have regarding this or if you feel you would like advice or support in helping your child attend more regularly. Carclaze Community Primary School is committed to maximising the education of all its pupils and aims to work with parents to ensure this can be achieved.

* For an offence under the Education Act 1996 Sec 444 (1) the maximum fine is £1000. For an offence under the Education Act 1996 Sec 444 (1A) the maximum fine is £2500 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 3 months. Alternatively, a penalty notice may be issued under Section 444A and 444B of the Education Act 1996. This carries a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the penalty notice may result in Court action.

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Pupil Premium

You will all be aware that all public services are experiencing reduced funding year on year. Therefore, we are asking you to take just a few minutes to read the very important Pupil Premium letter which we will be sending out today by satchel post as you might be able to help us with additional funding for the school. We know we have new and existing parents who are probably officially eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) because they are currently in receipt of certain benefits. The problem is that because all Infant children now automatically receive Universal Free School Meals, many parents have forgotten to register their eligibility and are not aware that if they do so, this brings an additional £1,300 (Pupil Premium Funding) per registered child per year to the school. This is money that the school benefits greatly from and which is used in lots of invaluable ways, as outlined in the Pupil Premium letter. Even if you are only eligible for Free School Meals for a short period of time and then your circumstances change, as long as you have registered your child will continue to benefit from Pupil Premium Funding for their entire school education. This is in the region of an additional £17,000 being invested in your child's education.

If you are in any doubt as to whether you are eligible for the PPF, then just complete and return the application form to the school an[d let us do the checking for you. It is really important that you complete all the information asked for on this form, if you feel you are eligible, to help make sure schools, in these financially-straitened times, receive all the funding that they are entitled to. Thank you for your support in this matter.
