
Attendance Ladder

Parent Behaviour

We expect parents to demonstrate the good behaviour we want of our children. Unfortunately on a few occasions this week this has not been the case.

Please consider the following:

Parking

We have one of the biggest car parks of any school around but it is still tricky to fit everyone in. We are working on some solutions but in the meantime, please do not park on the paved area. Please consider parking a little further away and walking.

Speaking to the office staff

The staff in the office want to help. If you are feeling cross, worried or disappointed please do not shout or swear at them.

Parent disagreements

If another parents actions upset you - for example their parking - please think about how you respond. Rather than shout and swear please report them to the office (with their registration number).

If you believe another child has hurt or upset your child please come and speak to a member of school staff so that we can find out the whole story. Do not send angry messages to the other child's parent online. This can be online abuse and will not solve a problem.

When we identify poor parent behaviour we will follow the policy that means issuing a warning and then if it persists banning parents from the school premises.



In the news this week

More than 100 schools across the UK have been affected by a potentially dangerous concrete used in their construction between the 1950s and the mid-90s. The crisis has left some school staff struggling to find temporary teaching accommodation and forced many pupils to begin their academic year learning online. It's not just schools affected; more than 30 hospitals are also believed to be at risk, according to experts.
