Behaviour Agreement

Before you send your child back to school. Please read and sign the amendment to the behaviour agreement that has been sent out electronically and is on the school website.

Behaviour Policy Amendment in response to Covid 19 (1st June - 24th July 2020)

Please be aware that the following reasonable adjustments have been made in addition to our Behaviour Policy and will take effect from June 1st 2020 until the end of this academic year.

All staff are expected to teach and model the new behaviour expectations and any systems in place to support them.

A zero-tolerance approach to any instances of poor behaviour will be in place to support the safety and the learning of all pupils in school during this time.

If pupils display any of the following behaviours, they will receive the indicated sanction

Behaviour	Action	Sanction
Deliberately not following school instructions on hygiene, such as handwashing and sanitising	Adults to model and more closely supervise. Parents informed	Should this become persistent then sent home for rest of day
Deliberately running away from adults to access out of bounds areas, including those areas of school that will be temporarily prohibited in light of the current circumstances	Adults to explain the reasoning and de-escalate using appropriate strategies. Parents informed	Should this become persistent then sent home for rest of day. If this behaviour is repeated the pupil will be sent home for the remainder of the term.
Deliberately running into other children's learning or outdoor spaces. Refusing to remain in your group's space or area	Adults to explain the reasoning and de-escalate using appropriate strategies. Parents informed	Should this become persistent then sent home for rest of day. If this behaviour is repeated the pupil will be sent home for the remainder of the term.
Deliberately not following desig- nated routes around school	Adults model correct movement around the school.	Should this become persistent then sent home for rest of day
Deliberately spitting	Remove other children and adults to a safe distance. Contact the parents of the child and the child who has been spat at.	Sent home for the remainder of the Summer Term
Deliberately coughing in the di- rection of other pupils and/or adults	Remove other children and adults to a safe distance. Contact the parents of the child and the child who has been coughed at.	Sent home for the remainder of the Summer Term
Deliberately making any inappro- priate and insensitive comments or displaying insensitive behav- iours linked to the Covid-19 pan- demic. For example, a pupil say- ing, "Your mum has coronavirus."	Explain to the child why what they have done is inappropriate. Contact parents. Speak to the child who has been affected. Contact their parents.	Should this become persistent then sent home for rest of day

some of the strategies we use for de-escalation and behaviour management cannot be used in the current circumstances, an individual risk assessment will be made for a child based on the following:

If they have an individual behaviour or communication plan

If the school deems it to be necessary due to behaviour of the pupil before lockdown

The risk assessment will be discussed with parents prior to returning. Where it is deemed that a child is too high a risk to come into school and keep themselves and others safe, the school will work with the parents and child to support a gradual transition into school at an appropriate time when routines have been established at school.



The Summer Reading Challenge

Despite current circumstances, the annual Summer Reading Challenge will still take place this year. The challenge for children aged 4-12 to read 6 books over the Summer will be a little different, you can find out more details about this year's digital challenge at www.summerreadingchallenge.org.uk

To help children get free access to reading material, Cornwall Library Service have provided each child in the school with an electronic library card number. This will allow them free access to e-books and e-audiobooks through the Borrowbox library app. There are no overdue charges, no loan charges, it is completely free!

Children will be able to access this material in school and from home if a mobile device is available.

If you wish to access from home, the library card number will be provided for you next week

You will need to:

- · Download the Borrowbox app (available for all Android and Apple devices)
- · Sign in.
- · In the Library box select Cornwall Libraries Primary School
- \cdot Type your library card number in the Borrower Number box
- · Your PIN is the last 4 digits of your library card number

 \cdot The first time you log in you will need to enter an e-mail address – this is not shared and is only used to let you know when your reservations are available or if a book needs to be renewed.

 \cdot If siblings are sharing a device then it is recommended that only one login is used. Borrowbox remembers which page of the book you have reached but if you log out and then back in again, this page number is

lost. Each login can borrow up to 10 ebooks and 10 e-audiobooks so there should be enough for two users.

 \cdot Books are borrowed for 2 weeks after which they disappear from your device. If you haven't finished you can renew for up to four more weeks. If you finish your book quickly or decide you don't like it then you can return it early.

· You're all set. Start reading or listening!

(Just like in a real library some books will have waiting lists. If a book you want is not available immediately click Reserve and add yourself to the end of the queue. If waiting lists become too long Cornwall Libraries will look to buy extra copies.) There will always be something available to borrow.

If you wish to upgrade this electronic membership to a full Cornwall Library membership then you can join up for free at your local library when these reopen and have access to the huge range of Books, DVDs, and activities that are available.

If your child already has a Cornwall Library Card they can of course use this. However you may prefer to use this new membership number when using Borrowbox as it will only contain children's books.

It's so easy to take part

- Children sign up to our easy-to-use website and create their
 own profile at sillysquad.org.uk from 5th June onwards.
- They set their own challenge to read any amount of books during the Challenge, with children being encouraged to read anything that makes them happy – whether it be comics, joke books, poetry, fiction or non-fiction; in digital or print format; from e-book lending through the public library service or from what they already have at home.
- Each time they finish a book, they add it to their profile and write a review. They are rewarded with activities and incentives along the way, such as online badges, games and videos.
- Families are encouraged to join in and 'Get Silly' with downloadable activities, games, quizzes and more. With new content to enjoy each week, the fun will continue throughout the summer to keep families engaged.
- They receive a downloadable certificate once they've completed their challenge!

Residential Trips:

We have recieved notification from our Central Finance Team that all 'Residential' payments have now been refunded via Parent Pay.

If you have paid for your child to attend a School Residential Trip (London, Deleware and BF Adventure) this term then due to cancellation this has now been refunded to your Parent Pay Account.

To realease the monies back to the Debit/Credit Card that you made the original payment on - you need to login and click on the withdraw button.

Note from Parent Pay:

'As well as receiving an email notification, a payer will get a notification when they log into the ParentPay system for the first time after a refund has been processed to their Parent Account.

This notification will explain to payers the amount, the pupil, and the payment item associated with the refund. The payer will then be able to use the refunded amount to pay for another item, or can choose to withdraw the amount back to their payment card/account'

We plan to re-book the Delaware and BF Adventure Residentials for 2021. Therefore Year 3 will go to BF Adventure in Year 4 and Year 4 will go to Delaware in Year 5

Contact during exceptional circumstances: Safeguarding Concerns

It is important that all children, families and professionals are able to contact key staff to share information in respect of safeguarding and concerns. To add additional capacity during this time of school closure, CELT will create a bespoke email for the Primary and Secondary settings within our trust. The email for all concerns at Carclaze is:

primarysafeguarding@celtrust.org

This email address will provide an automated message response which states that the email will be monitored during office hours (Monday to Friday)

The email addresses will be monitored by the Chief Information Officer for the Trust, who will then forward emails to the appropriate safeguarding teams in schools/academies for action.

However, you should contact Social Care and Police if you believe a child or young person is at risk of imminent harm.

Free School Meals

The DfE is providing meal vouchers whilst schools are only open to children of Key Workers.

Your child may be eligible for benefits-related free school meals if you, or the child themselves in their own right, receives of any of the following benefits:

Income Support (IS)

Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance

Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance

Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190

Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)

Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Support

Universal Credit - Your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get) as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods
