Well done Fred - Riding your bike for 100 miles and raising over £500 - just amazing!

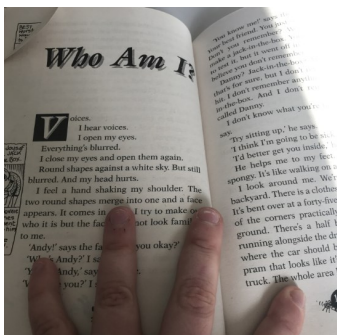


Well Done to C.Collings on completing 100 laps in honour of Sir Tom Moore. Creating a mud track around the garden!! Raising over £160 - just brilliant.

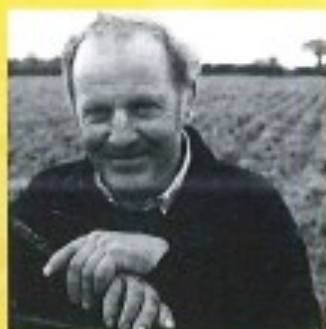
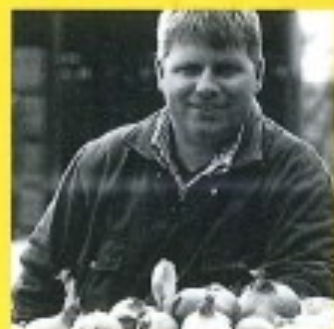
