### Key learning

The Angles, Jutes and Saxons travelled from Denmark, The Netherlands and Germany to Britain.

The Anglo Saxons settled in 'Angle land'. The country was divided into 7 kingdoms.

### Significant individuals:

- King Alfred the Great (849-899AD)

   an Anglo-Saxon who fought the Vikings
- St Augustine—a monk sent by the Pope in Rome to convert the Anglo Saxons to Christianity. He became the first Archbishop of Canterbury.
