Parent Behaviour

Please consider the following:

Parking

Speaking to the office staff

Parent disagreements

If another parent's actions upset you - for example their parking - please think about how you respond. Rather than shout and swear please report them to the office (with their registration number).

If you believe another child has hurt or upset your child please come and speak to a member of school staff so that we can find out the whole story. Do not send angry messages to the other child's parent online. This can be online abuse and will not solve a problem.

When we identify poor parent behaviour we will follow the policy that means issuing a warning and then, if it persists, banning parents from the school premises.
