Dear Parents/Carers

Although for a very sad reason, both children and staff alike benefitted from an additional day at the weekend to rest, recover and reflect after a busy start to term and the emotional nature of both National and local news.

Emotional health and well-being remains a high priority at Carclaze. As well as our school counsellor Sam Lenz-Williams, we also have a wider mental health team, led by Mrs Wood, who oversee and monitor the well-being of all children and staff. All staff have Trauma Informed Schools (TIS) training and we work hard to ensure that all children have the opportunity to share how they are feeling during the school day, either on an individual or group basis.

Additionally, this year we are rolling out a new PSHE scheme of work called 'No Outsiders' which uses well-known picture books and stories to encourage children to be welcoming and supportive of everyone, regardless of difference.

In order for us to best support children, it is important that we know as much as possible about factors in their home lives which may be impacting on their well-being so please always update school (either in person, on the phone or via an eSchools message) about any changes happening in your child's life which may help us to better understand them.
