CELT Review of Wraparound Care Provision 2025 – Charges

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are writing to inform you of a planned increase to our wraparound costs from September 2025. This decision has been made reluctantly to ensure that we cover increases to staff costs.

Breakfast and after school wraparound childcare costs will be inclusive of breakfast and snack.

Pricing and Charging: from 1 September 2025

Pricing and charging for all CELT Schools will be £5.00 per hour, with effect from 1 September 2025.

Penalty charges may be added to un-booked places and late pick-ups (charged at £5.00 per 15 minutes).

Parents / carers will continue to be required to book and pay in advance using ParentPay by Thursday of the preceding week.

Cancellation refunds will not be possible after the proceeding Thursday booking due to planned staffing arrangements.

Wraparound Care which is optional and an extension to the school day, that are managed, operated and staffed by the academy trust such as Breakfast, After School and Holiday clubs at the set hourly rate, and must be invoiced and paid for in advance.
