# Summer term attendance expectations for schools

School attendance continues to be mandatory for all pupils and the usual rules on school attendance apply.

This includes parents' duty to ensure their child regularly attends school, and schools' and local authorities' ability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty no-tices, for poor attendance.

As restrictions begin to lift, we know some families may be looking to take holidays during term time. As usual, parents should plan their holidays around school breaks and avoid seeking permission to take their children out of school on holiday.

It has been announced that we will be able to pay Free School Meals Vouchers for the May Half Term. These will be issued in the normal way (a voucher emailed out - £15.00 per eligible child). If you are entitled, please look out for your funding next week.
