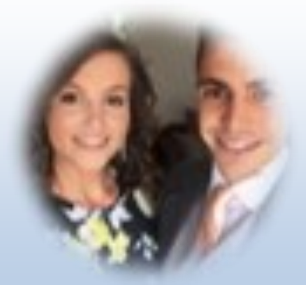

Mrs Bray has also welcomed many parents to school, developing relationships, settling first day nerves, and helping them leave their children at the gates for the first time. She has been an educator, an inspiration, an advocate, archivist, artist, cheerleader, counsellor, event coordinator, interior designer, mediator, nurse, storyteller, role model and friend. Persistently going missing from school or home, or being found out-of-area



Unexplained acquisition of money, clothes or mobile phones



excessive receipt of texts or phone calls



Relationships with controlling, older individuals or gang association



Leaving home or care without explanation



Suspicion of self-harm, physical assault or unexplained injuries



Parental concerns



Significant decline in school performance



Significant changes in emotional well-being

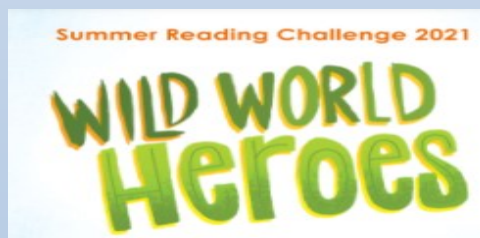
The link is also on the school website and has been shared on social media.

BUMBLE



BUMBLE IS SIMILAR TO THE POPULAR DATING APP 'TINDER' HOWEVER, IT REQUIRES WOMEN TO MAKE THE FIRST CONTACT. KIDS HAVE BEEN KNOWN TO USE BUMBLE TO CREATE FAKE ACCOUNTS AND FALSIFY THEIR AGE.

SNAPCHAT

WHISPER



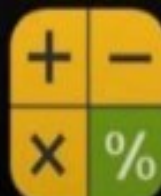
