Summer term attendance expectations for schools

School attendance continues to be mandatory for all pupils and the usual rules on school attendance apply.

This includes parents' duty to ensure their child regularly attends school, and schools' and local authorities' ability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices, for poor attendance.

As restrictions begin to lift, we know some families may be looking to take holidays during term time. As usual, parents should plan their holidays around school breaks and avoid seeking permission to take their children out of school on holiday.

Wrap Around Care:

In order to reserve your place, it will have to be **booked for and paid for in advance, by Friday lunchtime**. Failure to do this will mean that your child will not be allocated a place and you will be expected to collect your child at their normal collection time.

Late collection fees will be charged to cover the staffing costs required for unplanned supervision and you will be expected to clear this fee before your child can attend another session.
