You will love this story with cute and curious Bush Baby.





Top 5 tips for story writers

- 1. Read as much as you can. Read anything and everything poetry, comics, non fiction, stories...
- 2. Write lots. Keep a note book for ideas and have a go at writing stories, the more you practice the better you will get
- 3. Get it written, then get it right. Don't worry about spelling or grammar when you first write your story, just get it down on paper and then you can edit it and tidy it up afterwards

4. Let your imagination go wild! Anything can happen in stories

5. Have lots of fun!



Q&A with Laura James

Why do you like writing about animals?

I think I've always wondered what they're thinking! I love the idea of them having their own lives that we know very little about. What do they think of us, for example?!

Do you have a favourite dog breed?

I can certainly spot a dachshund a mile off and I always go over and chat with fellow owners. But to be honest I love all breeds, and of course, the ones that are their own special blend of breeds, are often the best. We had several dogs when I was growing up and our extended family always seemed to have dogs too. I've known labradors, westies, corgis, papillons, labradoodles, boxers and many more, as canine friends and I've loved them all.

Do you have any animal book recommendations?

There are so many to choose from but I do love the Claude books by Alex T Smith. When I was growing up I read The One Hundred and One Dalmatians, by Dodie Smith and desperately wanted a dalmatian. Also, Charlotte's Web, by E.B. White, which made me cry, and I remember really enjoying Saddlebottom by Dick King-Smith.








Q&A with Laura James

What top tips do you have for young writers?

I always say if you start by creating interesting characters and develop your plot from there, you're onto a winner. If your characters are interesting your readers are going to want to keep reading but if they're boring they won't care what happens to them, even if you've written a knock-out plot.




Are you brave enough to solve the mystery?





Ian feels trapped just like Dadu. Ian just happens to be an octopus - an octopus who can communicate with Sashi!

"I enjoyed this book because it has a moral and shows that sometimes you can be trying to do the right thing, but get it wrong, that it's okay to get things wrong, and it's never too late to try to fix things.

People who like adventure stories, animals and learning facts would like this book.






