Monday 4th March - Booknic - parents and carers are welcome to come and share books with the children in a relaxed way throughout the school. Come along at 2.30 and read together.




In the news this week



About: Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756 – 1791) was a prolific and influential composer of the Classical period. Despite his short life, his rapid pace of composition resulted in more than 800 works of virtually every genre of his time. Many of these compositions are acknowledged as pinnacles of the symphonic, concertante, chamber, operatic, and choral repertoire. Mozart is widely regarded as among the greatest composers in the history of Western music. His Requiem was largely unfinished by the time of his death at the age of 35, the circumstances of which are uncertain and much mythologised. Genres: Classical, Opera, Chamber, Choral Active from: 1764-1791 Origin: Salzburg, Austria
