Dear Parents/Carers

I have said it in this space many times, but it is always worth repeating, if we do one thing to give our children the best possible future it needs to be to support them in developing a love of reading.

In 2002 the OECD research concluded that:

"Reading for pleasure is the single most important indicator of a child's future success".

We need parent and carer support with this as children spend more time at home than in school. If you're not sure of how you can help there are two opportunities to get ideas, talk to staff, and read with children coming up before half term.

Monday 17th October - Foundation Stage parents are invited to a presentation on early reading, phonics and reading for pleasure. This will be in the hall at 2 pm.

Thursday 21st October - All parents are invited to have a coffee and listening to a 20-minute presentation before joining their children to read. This will start in the hall at 9 a.m.

We look forward to as many people joining us as possible.

During the first week after the half term break, we will hold telephone parent consultations. These will be bookable via eSchools, look out for the link.

Parents of children who have a SEND support plan will receive a letter inviting them to a meet the teacher and SENCO. If you do not receive a letter or cannot make the appointment, then please book a telephone consultation with your class teacher.
