Administering Medication Reminder:

As you know - we are always happy to administer medication at Carclaze School in order to help your child return from illness or get them through the day during hayfever season etc

- All medication must be in its original packaging - including prescribed medication
- Medication must be handed into the office as we will need to complete a form with you
- Please note - we cannot accept medication that contains ibuprofen.
- Parents are welcome to arrange a time with the office to come in and administer medication if you wish to do so
- Antibiotics will only be given if prescribed for 4 times a day. Prescribed medication that is to be taken 3 times a day can be done before and after school

A vehicle once used by Pope Francis to wave and greet people—called a popemobile—is being turned into a mobile health clinic for children in Gaza. Pope Francis, who recently passed away, was the head of the Catholic Church and often spoke about helping others. One of his final wishes was to help children affected by the conflict in Gaza. The vehicle will be refitted with medical equipment, as found in ambulances, so it can be used to aid children in areas where hospitals may be hard to reach. The project aims to deliver essential medical care to those who need it.
