



Pupil premium Budget Statement: Carclaze Primary School. 2017/2018.

What is the Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium is additional funding to help schools close the difference between children from low-income and disadvantaged families and their peers. If a child is eligible for free school meals (FMS) at any point over the past 6 years or has been continuously looked after for at least 6 months (LAC) the school receives an amount per head within their budget. A provision is also made for children who have a parent in the armed services.

Carclaze:

At Carclaze we have a clear, strategic approach to the use of specific Pupil Premium funding and plans are integrated into wider school support and improvement systems. These are monitored and evaluated regularly and in depth data analysis ensures that the correct support and strategies are identified to maximise progress. Our key priority is to ensure the difference between Pupil Premium children and nationally non pupil premium children is minimised.

At Carclaze we aim to target additional support strategies which result in every pupil, however financially disadvantaged, being able to have full access to the curriculum and all our extra-curricular experiences.
