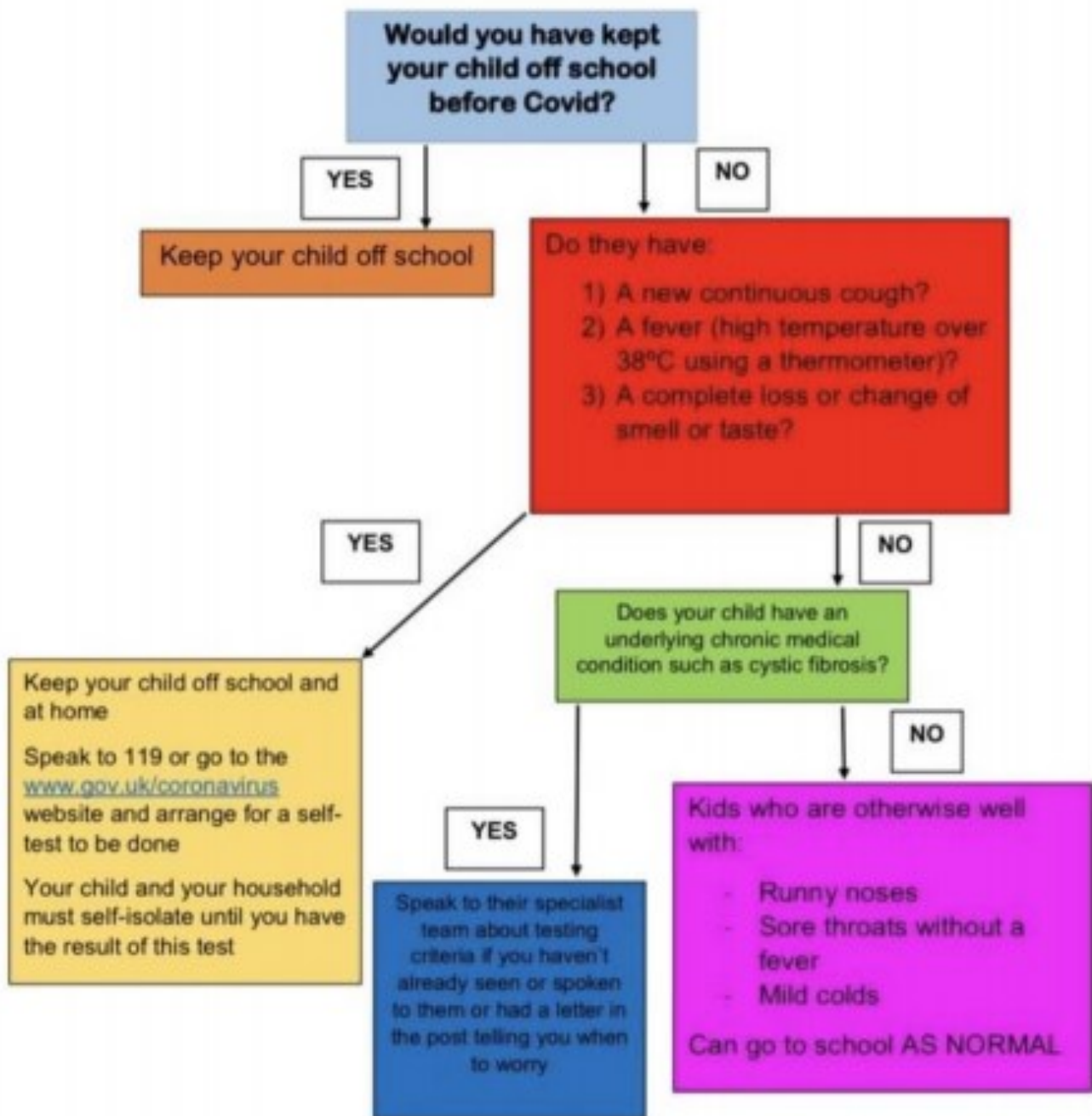
## SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

As per our information sent out during the summer holidays, please be reminded that school attendance is compulsory from September 2020 and all former attendance procedures are back in place. This means that no holidays during term time will be authorised, unless there is deemed to be an exceptional circumstance. Any holidays of 5 days or more will incur a penalty notice fine being issued per parent/per child. Any leave of absence must be requested via our Leave of Absence Form which can be collected from Reception. Please see the copy of the warning letter attached to this email. If your child is presenting with the following symptoms you must contact 119 for advice <https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/> a

- high temperature
- a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual) a
- a loss or change to their sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.
- The following flow chart was being shared on social media over the weekend and is a handy guide for parents/carers to refer to when considering your child's attendance at school in relation to their illness.





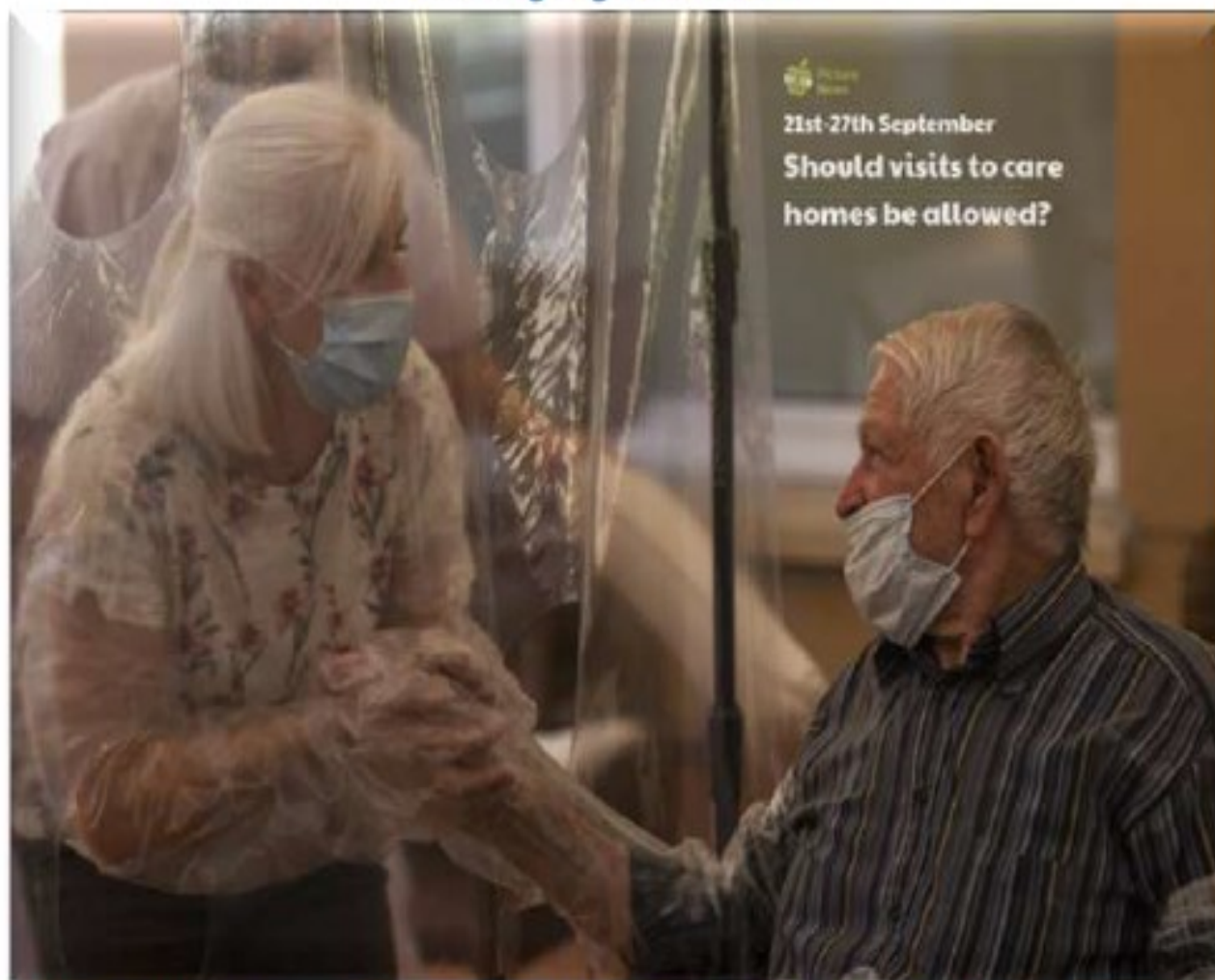

### **Early Birds / Busy Bees**

Due to reduced capacity under our current Covid-19 compliant operating structure children can only attend Breakfast / After School club if they have been booked in (via ParentPay) by the Friday of the week before. Please ensure you are adding enough monies for the bookings you are making. Please try and book and pay only for weekly care as this will help us keep track of your bookings and payments.

## Drop off / Pick up

As you will be aware from previous letters we have staggered start and finish times in order to minimise the number of adults waiting in school and make it easier to maintain social distancing.

We have learnt a few lessons from this week which will help when everyone is back from Monday.

**Please arrive as close to your allocated time as possible.** If you are early please can you wait in the car until the previous year group has cleared.

- Children will leave at the time of the oldest sibling, unless you have given permission for children in Year 4 upwards to walk home by themselves.
- Children in Year 4 upwards need permission to walk home by themselves.
- Please maintain social distance of 2 metres whilst waiting.
- Masks may be worn to and from school if you wish.
- Please do not block access to stairs and paths while waiting.
- Please follow arrows where they are in place.

## September 2020 Governor vacancy at Carclaze School

Are you passionate about our future generations? Do you want to make difference to young people? Would you like to develop your own skills? Do you have some time to give to our wonderful community? Have you ever thought about becoming a school governor.....?

Carclaze Primary School is currently seeking new individuals to join our Governing Board. To be a school governor you don't need to have a background or experience in education, or be a parent or a parent of a child at the school - what we need are people who are over 18; engaged; passionate; committed; confident in having courageous conversations; curious with an enquiring mind; able to challenge the status quo to improve things; collaborative to build strong relationships; critical to improve their own work and that of the board and creative in problem solving....phew! Sounds like a lot but you know who you are.

For those that don't know, a Governing Board provides strategic leadership and accountability to the school. Governors are one of the largest volunteer forces in the country and have an important part to play in raising school standards. The role of the governing board is absolutely key to the effectiveness of a school. They are expected to question and challenge leadership and to hold them to account. This is a position with a term of four years and involves meetings approximately every half term.
