# Remember, Remember to Read in November



# **Upcoming Dates**

'<u>Carclaze Open Afternoons'</u> - We look forward to welcoming parents and carers into school on the afternoon of Thursday 24th November. This will give you the opportunity to look at your child's books and work with them, as well as see the classroom environment. Due to the fact that we will still need to end the day at the usual time, please make sure you arrive at school at the following times:

EYFS/KS1 - please arrive from 2:30 and no later than 3.00 (please enter through the patio gate)

# In the news this week

The men's FIFA World Cup 2022 has started in Qatar and will run until 18th December. It is the 22<sup>nd</sup> edition of the competition, and the first played in the Arab world. The 64 matches of the tournament will take place across eight venues in the country. Usually, the event takes place in summer but because of the extreme heat at that time of year, it has been moved to a November-December winter slot. though temperatures will still reach about 25°C. The decision to stage the tournament in Qatar has been criticised because of concerns over the country's poor treatment of the large number of workers from other countries, employed to help them prepare for the tournament.

#### Things to talk about at home ...

- Have you been watching the World Cup so far? Share your thoughts on the tournament.
- As the World Cup is held in different countries, do you think it provides an opportunity for people to learn about life in other parts of the world?

Children in EYFS will now need to come to school at 8:35am each morning (as opposed to 8:45am). This is so that they receive their statutory 6.5 hours of education per day. This is a recent Government change but one we wanted to introduce later so that the children got used to the morning procedures in their first half term of school.

Please continue to drop them off at the patio gate. However, we encourage you to send them in through the smaller gate next to the kitchen as this will separate them from Years 1 and 2 children also coming in at that time.

Please speak to the office if you would like more information about breakfast club (running from 7:30am each morning) which may be beneficial for parents who may find it easier to drop off even earlier.


